I was so stupid No, fifty's not old. That woman of fifty was pure solid gold, twenty four carat, or so I was told.


Back Grounder

Maria de los Dolores Asunsolo Lopez- Negrete was born in Durango Mexico in 1905. She studied at Liceo Franco Mexicano and spoke perfect French. She had a passion for ballet and performed at many gatherings for wealty Mexicans. She met Jamie Martinez del Rio, they fell in love and were married in 1921. She was sixteen and he was 34. She was discovered by Edwin Carewe and the couple was invited to Hollywood, Dolores as an actress and Jaime as a screenwriter. Her first film was Joanna released in 1925. Jamie died in 1929. In 1930 Dolores married Cedric Gibbons. They lived in Santa Monica in a beautiful home built by Gibbons. In 1940 Dolores met Orson Wells, the two fell in love and stayed together for two years. She was divorced from Gibbons in 1941. She returned to Mexico and became a very big star in Spanish movies. She married Lewis Riley in 1959 and returned to the USA. Dolores died in 1983 at age 77 in Newport Beach Ca. She was cremated. Her ashes are interred in Mexico.
